## REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and

streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.

- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation. Some projects that you may not know need permits include:
  - Hot water heater replacement
  - Air conditioning unit replacement
  - Furnace replacement
  - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). \*\*\* PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)\*\*\*

★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.

★ **Trash & Yard Waste** - Waste Management Guidelines:

All waste materials must be placed out at the curb for collection by 6:00am the day of your collection, but not before 5:00pm the

day before your pick-up. **This includes yard waste bags and containers.**

**Guard and Discard your prescription drugs**

In Illinois, prescription pain medication overdose deaths doubled between 2013 and 2016. Together with the Illinois Department of Human Services, the Health Department’s Prevention Services reminds you to “Guard and Discard” your prescription medications to help reduce prescription drug misuse. Prescription medications can be safe and effective if used as directed, but can be dangerous when used incorrectly. Proper disposal of prescription drugs can prevent misuse and accidental poisonings.

**Lake County has 32 prescription drug disposal boxes located at Police Departments and Walgreens.** Visit the [Drug Free Lake County website](http://Drug Free Lake County website) to find your nearest drug disposal box. If you or someone you know are impacted by addiction to opioids or other substances, you can call the Illinois toll-free helpline, 24 hours a day, seven days a week at 1-833-2FINDHELP.

**WATERCRAFT STICKERS/REGISTRATION**

Get your boat stickers and keys starting April 1st. Every watercraft must have **both** a state registration sticker and a Village sticker. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** If you purchase a new boat, a processed application for state registration from the DNR will be accepted for this year. The Village has past years’ registrations on file. If you are unsure of your status, please call the Village Hall. Boat stickers will not be issued without one of these documents. Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall or through the mail. To order by mail, send a check payable to the Village of Third Lake for the appropriate amount, a copy of current state registration, and a list of your watercraft by type and state registration numbers. For Mariner’s Cove boat launch keys contact the Mariner’s Cove Home Owner’s Association.



**It’s the Law!**

All Persons born after January 1, 1998 are required by Illinois State Law to take and pass a boating safety course validated by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and hold a valid boating safety certificate before they can operate a motorboat with an engine over 10 Horsepower. **THIS INCLUDES PERSONAL WATER CRAFT!**

≈ Persons at least 12 years of age and less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horsepower only if they are accompanied on the motorboat and under the direct control of a parent or guardian or a person at least 18 years of age designated by a parent or guardian, or the motorboat operator is in possession of a Boating Safety Certificate issued by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law enforcement, authorizing the holder to operate motorboats.
