1. Chairman Morthorst called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

3. Approval of Minutes August 26, 2019

Motion by Kure seconded by Mike Delacluyse to approve the minutes of the August 26, 2019 Lakes Commission meeting.

4. Discussion

A. Artificial Fish Structures

Discussion: The application and rules for fish cribs were presented with the following exceptions and additions. Depth of fish crib should be 12 feet from top of the crib to the water level. The water level is determined by the level of water at the top of the dam. GPS location of the fish crib should be made public and posted on website. One application is required for each fish crib. If the fish crib is to be placed on private property, the consent of the property owner is required.

Motion by Rohrer, seconded by Kure to recommend to the board to approve the application process and rules for fish cribs in Third Lake and Druce Lake.

B. Boat Launch Keys

- Chairman Morthorst suggested that keys must be purchased at same time a boat sticker.

C. DRWW Update

Chairman Morthorst explained the watershed to the guests in attendance and gave update on the DRWW meetings the he attended.

- ## D. Carp Harvesting Results – Hillstrom reported that a total of 17 carp were harvested approximately 2 weeks ago. West shore residents would like to be notified when carp harvesting is scheduled.

E. Hydrilla Contamination in Libertyville pond

Chairman Morthorst reported that a pond in Libertyville was contaminated with a highly invasive weed and will cost a significant amount of money to remove in order to prevent spreading into the watershed. The contamination was suspected to come from someone dumping either an aquarium or a water garden.

5. Open to the Floor

Rick Nasatir questioned the level of the dam. Butch Buckley explained dam is at same level as previous dam and debris in the old carp fence was causing the lake to be higher than normal.

Several committee members were concerned with silt load in lake. Chairman Morthorst should receive results and will report.

In response to questions from west shore residents, Chairman Morthorst reported that Clarke surveys the entire lake for invasive weeds and Third Lake did not need treatment this year. West shore would like to be notified if treatment is needed so that they can treat at same time.
