 - A. Lakes Ordinance 21-01-01 Chairman Morthorst asked Clerk Smith to discuss changes that were made to the Lakes Ordinance that was passed at the Board Meeting on January 19, 2021.
 - 1. <u>Section one: Registration Required</u> Watercraft larger than 10 ft need to be registered with the Village.
 - 2. <u>Section one: Temporary Pass</u> Added 'consecutive' to calendar days
 - 3. <u>Section one: Resident Fees</u> Eliminated a category for gas powered pricing and changed price for a guest boat launch key deposit.
 - 4. <u>Section one: Communities with Resident Rights</u> Identified the streets which are allowed to purchase boat stickers at a resident rate in the unincorporated areas that use the lake.
 - 5. Section Three: Lake Usage/Safety Rules Set No Wake speed limit
 - 6. <u>Section Three: Flag Communication</u> Created use of a yellow flag to communicate information regarding lake.

- 7. <u>Section Three: Certain Motorized Watercraft Prohibited</u> Limited the size of electric motors to a 15 HP equivalent
- 8. <u>Section Three: Open Water Swimming</u> Added requirement of a high visibility float or cap. Commissioner Kure would like to see the addition of a spotter.
- 9. <u>Section Four: Location Limitation</u> Added that lift stations need to be adjacent to the pier.
- 10. <u>Section Three: Limitation of Ownership</u> Allows relatives to dock boat for the season with owner's permission. Commissioners agreed that this section is unclear and could increase number of boats on the lake.
- 11. <u>Section Five: Enforcement and Penalty</u>: Increases penalty for unpaid fines and gives ability to issue another a fine each day that there is an offense.
