DO I NEED A PERMIT?

Permits are required for most construction and remodeling projects in order to ensure the safety of the work and its compliance with building, construction, and zoning codes. The Village of Third Lake has the updated Ordinance 21-03-01 regarding permits on our website. Below is a list of some of the projects that require a permit.

Projects Requiring Permits

Roof Fence Water Heater Generator Additional Structures Solar Panels New Residential Home

Deck. Brick or Concrete Patio Detached Garage Fireplace Remodel (Structure Changes) Siding AC/Furnace Replacement Window Replacement Swimming Pool/Hot Tub Driveway Replacement Sheds Tree Removal Sewer Repair Attached Screen Porch

Some permits may also require a Contractors Business License, approval from the Lake County Health Department (LCHD), Lake County Public Works (LCPW) or a call to JULIE before starting. In general, Roofing and Plumbing contractors need to have a business license on file with the Village. A permit from LCPW is required for sewer repairs 5' away from the home, if within 5' it's a permit from the Village. For Sunshine Subdivision, projects that break ground must obtain a permit from the Lake County Health Department before the Village issues your permit. For all digging projects it is highly recommended you call JULIE at 811 or (800)892-0123 as a safety measure.

How Long Does It Take To Get A Permit?

It can take approximately 10 business days once all the necessary requirements are submitted. Permit season starts in the Spring and may take longer depending on the demand.

How Much Does A Permit Cost?

A permit can have several variations that determine the cost and additional review fees. Some permits have standard fees and we can not give approximate costs for larger, more complex projects.

What Do I Do With The Permit Card?

Please display the permit card in the front most window where it can be seen from the street.

What To Do When The Project Is Done

After the work is complete, it is important to contact the phone number on the front of the permit card to schedule a final inspection and close out the permit.

How Long Is My Permit Good For?

A permit is good for 6 months. It is a good idea to keep in contact with the Village about any delays that may affect the completion of your project past 6 months.

Permit applications, Contractors Business License forms, LCHD and LCPW links are available on the Village website or at the Village Hall. We're here to help so if you have any questions as to whether your project requires a permit, please contact the Village Hall.

Boat stickers are required for every motorized watercraft on Third and Druce Lake. **Both** state registration and a Village sticker are required. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall. <u>BUOYS</u>

A "No Wake" area is declared for the area beginning at the shoreline and extending 150' into the lake in all areas. The no wake buoys have been set out to mark the distance.

SKI COURSE

The Board has approved the 2022 ski course for Third Lake in accordance with ORDINANCE NO. 22-02-02 While skiers are utilizing the course please be considerate of the skiers and not fish or park in the way.



LAKE HEALTH AND EXPLANATION OF AQUATIC PLANTS

What is needed for a healthy lake? The Illinois DNR recommends a 20% - 40% coverage of aquatic vegetation for a healthy lake. Identifying invasive plants vs. beneficial plants is important to keep lakes healthy and less algae blooms and lake closures. The goal of the Village is to treat invasive species in the lake. Early in the spring when vegetation starts to emerge, the lakes are surveyed and problem locations are identified for treatment. The Village works with both the Lake County Health Department and Clarke Environmental services to determine the best treatment for a healthy balance of vegetation in the lakes. CLARKE SURVEY

Clarke surveyed both Third and Druce Lakes on May 23rd, 2022. You may have seen their boats slowly trolling around the lake while the sonar beneath the boat gathered plant and lake data. They were strictly collecting data and not applying chemical applications. When the surveys are complete we will post the results on the website.
