Lake Health and Explanation of Aquatic Plants tour TBD

What is needed for a healthy lake? The Illinois DNR recommends a 20% - 40% coverage of aquatic vegetation for a healthy lake. Identifying invasive plants vs. beneficial plants is important to keep lakes healthy and less alge blooms and lake closures. The goal of the Village is to treat invasive species in the lake. Early in the spring when vegetation starts to emerge, the lakes are surveyed and problem locations are identified for treatment. The Village works with both the Lake County Health Department and Clarke Environmental services to determine the best treatment for a healthy balance of vegetation in the lakes. SPRING LEAF BURNING APRIL 15TH - MAY 15TH

Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter and yard waste may be burned between April 15 and May 15 and between November 1 and November 30 only. Burning is permitted between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm only and only allowed in a fireproof barrel or receptacle that is elevated above ground by at least 6" but no more than 24." **Burning is not permitted:**

When wind is in excess of 15 mph

Within 20' of any building or structure

Within 25' of any wetland, lake or other body of water, or Lake County Forest Preserve property

On Village streets, sidewalks or other public right of way. Must be attended at all times by someone 16 years and up Must have a water source and adequate means of delivering water immediately adjacent to the fire.

LAKE COUNTY ANNOUNCES \$90 MILLION FOR 2022 CONSTRUCTION

The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) announced the 2022 construction program that includes \$90 million for infrastructure projects to improve traffic congestion, increase safety, and reduce carbon emissions on Lake County's transportation system.

More than 35 transportation projects will be under construction in 2022, featuring intersection improvements, bridge and culvert replacements, bike path connections, and resurfacings.

Some of the projects include:

• Gilmer Road at Midlothian Road Intersection Improvement Reconstruction of the intersection of Gilmer and Midlothian Road in Hawthorn Woods. Improvements include additional through lanes, turning lanes, bike paths and sidewalks.

Hart Road at Flint Creek Bridge

Replacement Construction of a new bridge over Flint Creek, inclusive of pedestrian accommodations.

• **Deep Lake Road Resurfacing** Resurfacing of Deep Lake Road from IL 132 to IL 173 in Lake Villa, Lindenhurst and Antioch. Improvements include new pavement, creating paved bike-friendly road shoulders, and regrading ditch lines to improve drainage.

• Hunt Club Road at Washington St. Intersection Improvement Adding dual left turn lanes and a right turn lane on all legs of the intersection at Hunt Club Road and Washington St. in Gurnee. Extension of the bike path just east of the intersection will extend from Washington St. to the ComEd bike path just south of Dada Dr.

WASTE MANAGEMENT ANNUAL SPRING TRASH CLEANUP DAY

Your clean up days is scheduled on your trash day during the week of May 16th. The cleanup includes residential household rubbish, small motor vehicle parts drained of all fluids (gas, oil, washer fluid & antifreeze) furniture (must be manageable for driver to lift) carpeting weighing no more than 50 lbs after rolled, taped or tied & cannot exceed 4ft length & 2 ft width.

Boat stickers are required for every motorized watercraft on Third and Druce Lake. **Both** state registration and a Village sticker are required. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall. <u>PIERS</u>

All pier owners must display the street address of the property in Arabic numerals not less than 3" in height.

NO WAKE AREA

A "No Wake" area is declared for the area beginning at the shoreline and extending 150" into the lake in all areas of Third Lake under jurisdiction of the Village.

TRAFFIC RULES

When two watercraft are approaching each other "head on," each watercraft must bear to the right and pass the other watercraft on its left side. When a watercraft is approaching a watercraft propelled solely by sails or oars, the motorboat must yield the right of way to the sailboat or rowboat.

Drive your watercraft counter-clockwise around Third Lake for safety reasons.

2022 Flood Safety in Illinois

"Flooding is the most common disaster across the country and can threaten almost every community in Illinois," says the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) in partnership with all local Emergency Management agencies and the National Weather Service. "Flooding in Illinois is a constant widespread threat that affected all communities," said IEMA Director Alicia Tate-Nadeau. IEMA has partnered with FEMA Region-5 and the national FloodSmart Campaign which highlights the importance of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) including costs related to flooding, flood maps, and mitigation strategies.

• Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters Turn Around, Don't Drown!

- Stay off bridges over fast-moving water
- Just six (6) inches of water can knock you down
- One (1) foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away
- Update your family communications plan
- Build an emergency preparedness kit
- Know the differences between Flood Watches, Flood

Advisories, and Flood warnings
