COMMUNITY DATA SNAPSHOTS AVAILABLE

Want to know the demographics of Third Lake? There are new Community Data Snapshots for northeastern Illinois. Each snapshot summarizes demographic, housing, employment, transportation, land use, revenue, and water data.

The Community Data Snapshots include information about: •Population and households: Each snapshot includes demographic and economic information, including population, race and ethnicity, language, income, home ownership and more.

•Housing: This section covers information about housing type, size, and age.

•Transportation: Transportation data includes household vehicle availability, commuting, and vehicle miles traveled. The 2021 update also has new transit availability data.

•Employment: The employment data covers general workforce characteristics including employment rate and key industries.

•Land use: Each snapshot includes acres of residential, commercial, industrial, mixed use, agricultural, vacant, and other land uses. It also includes park access and walkability.

•**Revenue:** Data includes retail sales and property assessments, which form a community's tax base.

•Water supply: This section includes a municipality's water demand, price trends, and water loss data.

LAKE NEWS



Boat stickers are required for every motorized watercraft on Third and Druce Lake. Both state registration and a Village sticker are required. In order to purchase a Village sticker, you must have a valid current state registration on file with the **Village.** Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall. An Ordinance violation of \$50 per watercraft will be issued for each boat in the lakes without a sticker.

Stickers can be purchased at the Village Hall during office hours or over the phone with a credit card and be mailed to your home. Sticker sales start April 1st each year or you may pay in advance starting in May. Boat sticker forms for pre orders are located on our website at thirdlakevillage.com. Mail payments or email your completed form to Vstevens@thirdlakevillage.com and pay with a credit card. Small credit card fee applies for phone transactions. Illinois Department of Public Health is Offering a Back-to-School Shipment of 1 Million Free COVID-19 Rapid Tests for Illinois K-12 Public Schools

The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) announced today it is providing a one-time bulk shipment of 1 million over-the-counter (OTC) COVID-19 rapid antigen tests to K-12 public school districts outside of Chicago for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year. The tests will be provided free of charge.

The tests are being offered upon request and are intended to supplement testing at school districts for the duration of the upcoming school year. Only one request is permitted per district. The tests will be delivered to a single hub location in the district. Districts will then be responsible for distributing the tests to their local schools. The number of tests distributed will be based on the size of the district.

The OTC tests are intended to be distributed or to be administered in the following ways:

1) Providing tests to students with COVID-19 symptoms for at-home use, including the testing of family members or close contacts.

2) Testing of those who may have been exposed while in school.

3) Testing in alignment with the Illinois Test to Stay (T2S) program.

The tests are not intended to be used for regular screening purposes. IDPH continues to provide free weekly screening testing through SHIELD-IL and the Midwest Coordinating Center.
