LAKES

- Mayor Buckley stated that he started taking water samples for phosphorus in the five locations and tested the dissolved oxygen in Third Lake.
- Mayor Buckley said the compressors need new starters but will not be purchased until the next time service is needed.

FINANCE AND POLICY

- Mayor Buckley stated that the sales tax revenue from the Shell gas station was not being received by the Village. He explained that when the annexation took place there was an increase in sales tax revenue, however that increase was due to collecting sales tax from internet sales. He said that the annexation paperwork was sent to Lake County and the revenue from the Shell station will now be directed to the Village and that there is a potential for 6 months of back pay.

PLANNING

- Mayor Buckley said that there is an MFT number for the Lake Ave project. The engineer
 is working on the bid specifications for the projects for this year. Mayor Buckley is also
 coordinating with Lake County Forest Preserve for the their entrance and with Lake
 County Public Works for access to the lift station.
- Mayor Buckley explained that IDOT is now open to the idea of repairing the failing storm sewer at the detention pond on Grant since the Hwy 45 widening project was going to direct runoff to the detention area. Mayor Buckley explained that IDOT would require the Village to obtain the easements needed for the storm sewer.
- Mayor Buckley stated that the sediment removed near the dam is drying quickly and the machine to grade the material should be returned by Thursday.
